Terms and Conditions

- Provisional bookings may be made over the telephone and will be held for one month.
 Booking will only be confirmed on receipt of a booking form and deposit of £5 per player based on the numbers anticipated.
- We welcome as much notice as possible as to change of numbers, however final numbers must be confirmed 72 hours prior to your event. Please note that any reduction in numbers within 3 days of your booking will be charged for in full. A reduction in numbers may affect the quoted price for the package.
- Balance of payments must be made on the day of the event; this can be done by cash, cheque or card. Cheques payable to Melton Mowbray Golf Club.
- It is the responsibility of the Organiser to ensure that their party behaves appropriately, has the correct standard of dress and adheres to the tee times booked.
- All players are advised to carry insurance cover for the protection of themselves and others.
 The golf club cannot accept responsibility for articles lost or stolen.
- Play will be from the yellow tees. Slow play should be avoided at all times.
- Players are requested to replace all divots and repair all pitch marks. Buggies and trolleys should not be taken onto greens, tees or through bunkers. Bunkers should be raked after playing.

Dress Code for the Course (Gents)

- Collared shirts e.g. polo / turtle style sports shirts tucked into waistband
- Smart, full length slacks, chinos, corduroy, Plus Two's
- Tailored Golf Shorts cut to knee or just above knee, must be worn with trainer/sport socks (which must be visible above the golf shoe) or ankle or knee length socks. These must be white or colour co-ordinated.

Dress Code for the Course (Ladies)

- Shirts/blouses with collars (may be sleeveless), turtle neck, polo neck shirts
- Tailored trousers/3/4 length trousers (crop trousers)
- Shorts tailored and smart. Skorts and golf skirts
- NB. All shirts/blouses, unless designed to sit just below the waist, to be worn tucked into the waistband

Dress Code for the Course (Ladies and Gents)

- Shoes must be recognised golf wear either spiked or soft spiked
- Hats/caps/visors
- No Tee Shirts, rugby shirts, football shirts, sun tops, crop tops
- No Blue denim, jeans, camouflage/combat trousers, mid-calf,3/4 shorts or crops
- No Trousers tucked into socks
- No Shorts or trousers with patch or combat pockets, football style elasticated waist shorts

In Clubhouse (everyday wear)

• Clothing as noted above, with the exception of golf shoes and hats/caps/visors. These must be removed on entering the Clubhouse from outside or the locker room.
